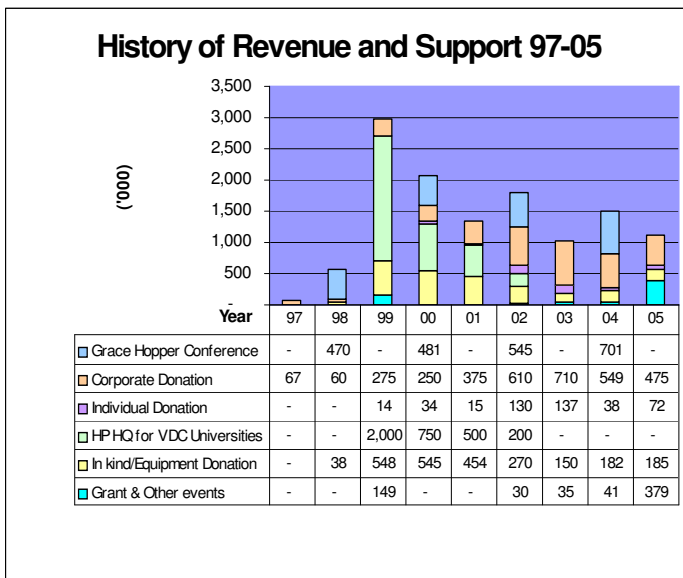
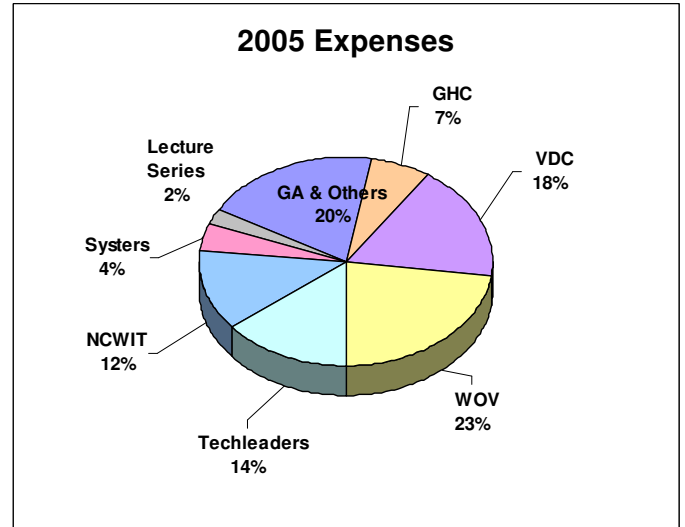


ANITA BORG INSTITUTE FOR WOMEN AND TECHNOLOGY

Revenue and support from 1997 through 2005 exceeded \$12.5 million. This includes significant computing hardware resources of \$3.5 million from Hewlett-Packard, for VDC sites. Corporate partners contributed \$3.4 million while the Grace Hopper Conference, held every other year, brought in \$2.2 million. In-kind and equipment donations were \$2.3 million. Individual donations, grants and other events combined were \$1.0M and continue to support our overall mission and goals.

Our revenues in 2005 were \$1.1 million and our expenses were \$1.3 million. Women of Vision, VDC and Techleaders are the major programs for 2005 totaling 55% of our expenditures. We have increased our investment in development and focused on more program activities including our major programs, an NSF sponsored NCWIT research study, Systems several ABI sponsored Lectures, and preparations for the 2006 Grace Hopper Conference.

This summary reflects financial positions and results of operations.
